Cons about Germany

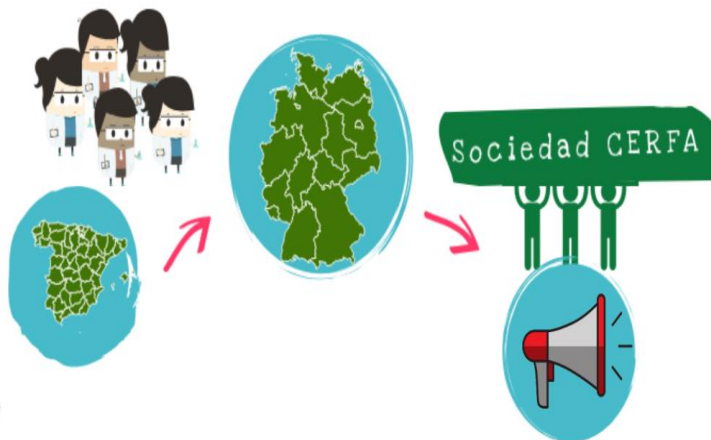

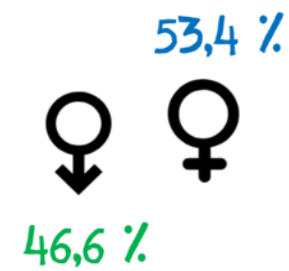
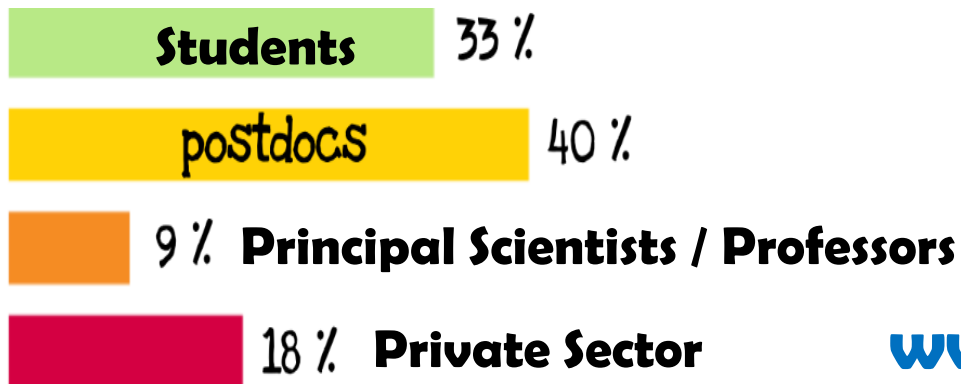
Cons about Germany
