ABSTRACT SUBMISSION to the IV ASEICA-ASPIC INTERNATIONAL MEETING

ASEICA is glad to invite you to submit a scientific abstract for the **IV ASEICA-ASPIC International Meeting**, that will take place in Santiago de Compostela on November 20-21,2025.

ABSTRACT KEY DATES

- ➔ **Submission Opening:** April 1, 2025
- ➔ **Submission Deadline:** September 10, 2025
- ➔ **Notification to the authors:** September 25. 2025

Oral communications:

The Scientific Evaluation Committee will select **6 abstracts for oral communications: 4 Short Talks** (15 minutes each) and 6 Flash Talks (5 minutes each) that will be included in the main scientific program.

Posters:

Participants with posters will have the opportunity to discuss their work. The posters will be displayed in a specific section in the congress venue.

Important Note: If you want to submit an abstract it is mandatory to be previously registered at the congress.

ABSTRACT INSTRUCTIONS:

- Abstracts can only be submitted online. [LINK](#)
- Before submitting your abstract, you must first register in the section “New authors” and the system will ask you for a username and a password. You will be able to submit abstract(s), edit them or modify your registration data until the submission deadlines. When ready, please upload your abstract in the section “Submit Abstracts”.
- **The presenting author must be a member of ASEICA or ASPIC.**
New ASEICA & ASPIC membership applicants will be also accepted. Abstracts will be only accepted upon **full registration** in the IV ASEICA-ASPIC International Meeting.
- Upon submission, you will receive an email by **September 26** indicating if the abstract is accepted and whether it has been selected as either a poster or an oral communication.

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- The deadline for the first author to confirm the presentation of the project is **October 10**.
- By submitting your work, you consent to include authors' names, affiliation, biographical material and the summary on the website of the symposium as well as in indexes or search databases in print, electronic, or other media.
- **Awards** will be given for the **best short talk**, the **best flash talk** and for the **best poster**.
- Sending the summary of the abstract implies full acceptance of these rules. The submitter signs for all co-authors. He/she accepts responsibility for the present rules for submission and presentation on behalf of all co-authors.

ABSTRACT FORMAT:

In order to be considered, an abstract should respect the following guidelines:

- All communications should be written in **English**.
- **Abstract titles** should be brief and should reflect the content of the abstract and the title should be no longer than 20 words. (*Do not write the title or authors on the space reserved for the abstract body*).
- **Abstracts should be organised under the headings:**
 - Brief introduction
 - Material and Methods
 - Results
 - Main conclusions
- **The main abstract text is limited to 400 words** but this does not include the information relating to title, author and affiliation.
- **Select the category** in which the abstract should be classified.
- **Authors:** No more than 10 authors can be listed. Only institutional affiliations, cities and countries should follow. Please enter the first author in the first place (this will be the contact person for the ASEICA Technical Secretariat).
- Please ensure that your abstract does not contain spelling, grammatical or scientific errors, as it will be reproduced exactly as submitted. No proofreading will be done.
- **Conflict of Interest statement:** Indicate if you or your co-authors have any potential conflict of interest to disclose in the context of the subject of this abstract.
- If applicable, information on grants and fellowships must be included at the end of the abstract text (and will be included in the word count).

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GUIDELINES ON POSTERS & ORAL COMMUNICATIONS:

ON POSTERS:

- If your abstract has been chosen as a poster, you must bring it printed on the **November 20**.
- The size of the poster must be **120 cm high and 90 cm wide**.
- In the congress you will find an abstract list with the main authors' names and the number assigned to the scientific abstract.
- Posters presenting time will be split in two different days. On a date close to the congress you will receive an email with the slot presentation time.
- It is mandatory to be in front of your abstract for the defense.
- The posters will be exhibited during the Congress.
- Format: fabric posters are not recommended as don't fit properly on the poster panels.

ON ORAL COMMUNICATIONS:

- Short Talks and Flash talks will be selected from abstracts to be presented as indicated in the program of the Congress.
- The first author will be the person in charge of making the presentation in **English** during the Congress.
- Those selected will have to send in advance the presentation (slides) of their lectures.
Deadline to send the PowerPoint: November 6.
- Only slides in PowerPoint format will be accepted.
